

NEW CANAAN - NORWALK - WILTON

The Boundaries of Silvermine

Silvermine is approximately 3 miles long (north to south), and 1 mile wide (east to west). At its northernmost point you will find the Silvermine Pond in New Canaan, which feeds the Silvermine River as it flows south. The river winds through the valley past the Silvermine Tavern and beneath the Merritt Parkway, ending near James Street. The development of a wild area on both sides of Buttery Road, once the Bridal Paths of Silvermine, establishes the western boundary. Finally, the eastern section reaches as far as Sier Hill Road, just beyond the Silvermine Golf Club.
