Eligibility Requirements:

1. Graduated from high school/technical school or anticipate graduation in the current year.
2. Accepted/anticipated acceptance by an accredited college or postsecondary (art, music or technical) school.
3. **Resident of the SILVERMINE AREA of New Canaan, Norwalk or Wilton.** See Silvermine street listing and map attached in the Appendix to this application.
4. **Member in good standing with the Silvermine Community Association.** The annual membership fee for joining the Silvermine Community Association is \$30 per residence. Payment may be made via PayPal at www.silverminenews.com or via check payable to: The Silvermine Community Association. Scholarship Criteria:

Scholarship awards are based upon the following criteria:

- Financial need – 50%
- Academic achievement – 30%
- Extra-curricular and/or work activities – 10%
- Interview with Scholarship Committee – 10%

Deadline:

Applications will be available after February 1st and may be obtained from your school's Guidance Counselor or Student Advisor or by downloading the application from <http://www.silverminenews.com/scholarships.htm>. 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Supporting Documentation That MUST Be Submitted with the Application:

1. Official school transcript, including grades and class standing for Grades 9-12.
2. SAT and/or ACT Scores.
3. **Three letters of recommendation. At least two must be from teachers. The third may come from guidance counselors, employers or others. Letters from relatives will not be accepted.**
4. A copy of either the College Scholarship Service College Financial Aid (CSS) and/or the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Financial need is a major criterion for awarding the scholarship, and eligibility will be, in part, determined by these standardized forms.

Required Interview:

All eligible applicants will be interviewed by the Committee in May or June, date to be determined. Scheduling for the interviews will be arranged after the April application deadline.

Final Decisions and Dispersal of Awards:

Final decisions will be made after all interviews have been conducted, with awards granted by August 1st.

Note that any scholarship grant will be paid directly to the school, crediting the student's account. It is the applicant's responsibility to supply the name of the school s/he will attend, once that decision has been made.

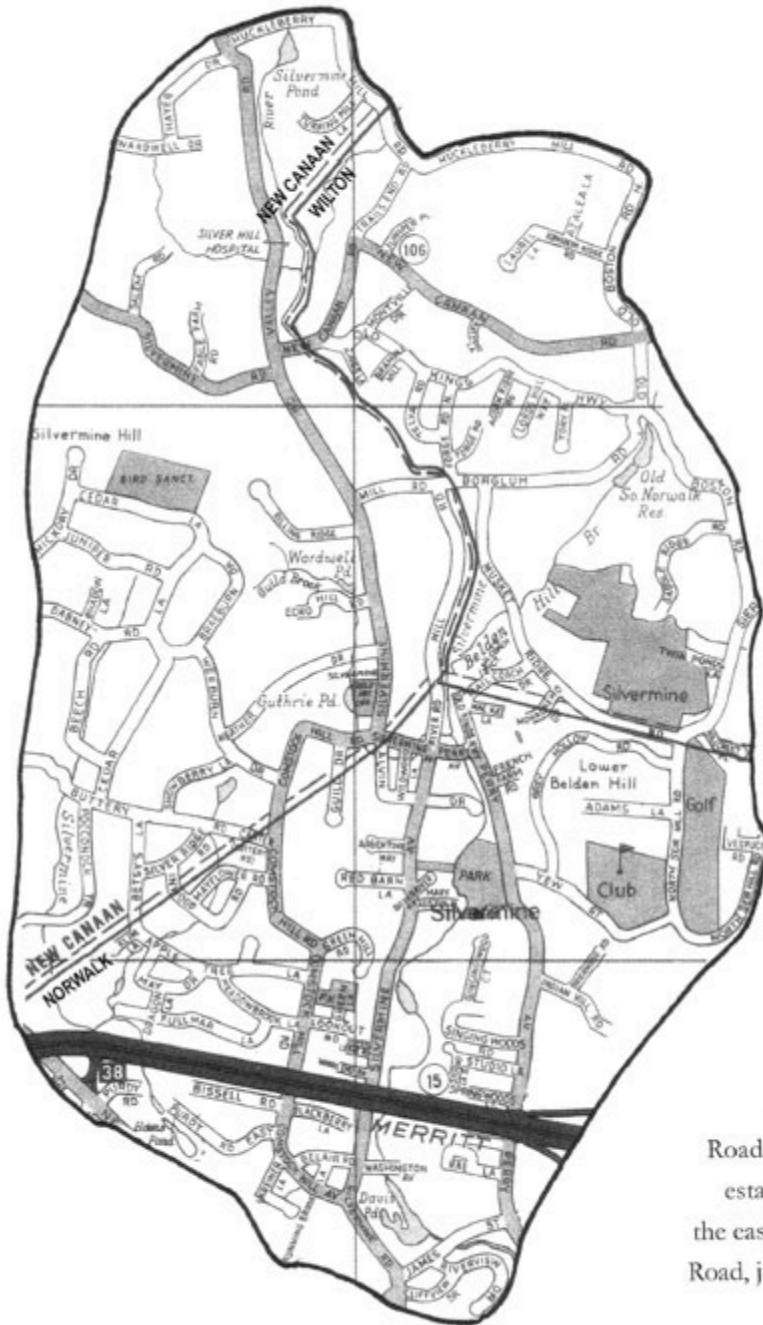

The Boundaries of Silvermine

Silvermine is approximately 3 miles long (north to south), and 1 mile wide (east to west). At its northernmost point you will find the Silvermine Pond in New Canaan, which feeds the Silvermine River as it flows south. The river winds through the valley past the Silvermine Tavern and beneath the Merritt Parkway, ending near James Street. The development of a wild area on both sides of Buttery Road, once the Bridal Paths of Silvermine, establishes the western boundary. Finally, the eastern section reaches as far as Sier Hill Road, just beyond the Silvermine Golf Club.
